Hello!

Ian has asked me to write a few words for this edition of 'Fountains', as a way of introducing myself and my wife, Jo.



We recently moved into Grewelthorpe, prior to my licensing as the new House for Duty Associate Priest in the Fountains Benefice. Jo and I have been overwhelmed by the very warm welcome we've received, both in Grewelthorpe and elsewhere – and huge thanks to everyone who generously contributed to the lovely hamper which greeted us on our arrival! We've really loved getting to know the local area and attending some great local events; and I look forward to joining in the work of the ministry team in these parishes.

We've just finished 9+ years in Catterick Garrison, where I was Vicar of the Hipswell Benefice. Jo manages a Mindfulness service for the NHS mental health trust. We have two children, a son of 22 and a daughter of 20 – both currently away at university, in Leeds and Brighton, respectively.

It's that time of year when the trees have shed their leaves and the evenings are really drawing in. It's easy to let the lack of light cause us to feel down, particularly when there's also so much heartbreak

splashed across our TV screens – the wars in Ukraine/Russia and Gaza/Israel, numerous other conflicts raging worldwide, and a host of natural disasters threatening the earth. One could be forgiven for thinking that it's all just darkness & gloom!

Yet this is *also* the time to remember that God took the darkness seriously, and the plight of the human race very much to heart; so much so that he chose to intervene personally and did so compassionately and decisively. And it all started with a young unmarried Jewish girl being visited one night by an angel. His message was that she would conceive miraculously and give birth to a son, who would become the Saviour of the world. Astonished and perplexed, Mary wanted some answers, yet finally said 'yes', agreeing to play her vital part in God's mission to save the world. Mary's encounter with Gabriel must have thrown her into months of darkness and discomfort. Yet eventually, in a distant town and after a long and painful journey, she was delivered of a beautiful boy. After all the waiting and not-quite-knowing, Mary's patient obedience was rewarded, as she welcomed Jesus into the world he had come to save. In his arrival, and soon that of shepherds also telling stories of angel messengers, she discovered God's light bursting through in all its hope and brilliance.

So, what is it that we're waiting for this Christmas? Or, maybe, *who* is it that we're waiting to welcome? Perhaps, as we gaze into the face of the baby in the manger, we might discover something of God's transforming love for us, too – a love which brings hope and light into even the darkest, most fear-filled corners of our lives?

Those who worship with us will be aware that over the past year or so we have been brushing the wafers at Communion with wine, for the benefit of those who felt too vulnerable to share the chalice. Our recent churchwardens' meeting agreed that, given the current state of public health, we would discontinue this practice and return to standard practice from before the pandemic. If anyone has particular concerns about this please let lan know and we will see what arrangements may be possible. The church's teaching is that receiving just the bread, for those who do not feel safe with the chalice, is full communion.

The Benefice Book Group

This month we have been reading "Under Their Very Eyes" by Tom Hamblin, not a novel this time, but an account of the author's life which he spends as a missionary, openly taking Bibles to give away in countries where Christianity is against the law and, in some cases, punishable by imprisonment or even death.

The style is not attractive or particularly easy to read; it is episodic and lacking in emotion but the subject matter and the sincerity of the writer compel one to go on reading. We all were impressed by the fact that the writer never in any way criticises or passes judgement on other ways of life or other faiths, but is completely focused on trying to convey to the rest of the world, the faith which sustains him. He makes no provision for his daily needs but is certain that God will provide him with food and shelter. This only scratches the surface of this remarkable account of a remarkable life.

I think that we all went home rather soberly, wondering afresh at the power of faith and praying that, given the opportunity, we would be enabled to live up to Tom Hamblin's high standard.

This month we are reading "The Last Runaway" by Tracy Chevalier which I suspect will prove to be a very different kettle of fish!

Henry Jenkins campaign gathers pace as Government approves £330,000 grant.

Well, it's been a rollercoaster ride ... but the prospects are now better than ever for realising our dream of bringing back the Henry Jenkins and making it even better than before.

The Government's decision to approve £330,000 grant funding for the Henry Jenkins Community Pub project has given a major boost to our long-running campaign. It means the Government is satisfied our business plan for the purchase and refurbishment of the Jenks - vetted by local experts in the hospitality sector - are credible. With £330k grant funding, another £330k anticipated capital from community share

purchases plus planned low interest loans, we are in a very strong position to create an exciting new social space.

There is just one major obstacle to overcome: The unwillingness of the owner to sell to us. That's why we've now begun discussions with the new North Yorkshire Council over a proposed compulsory purchase order to break the deadlock and secure the pub. Local councils have the power to make compulsory purchases where community assets are at risk, where a credible community group is willing to buy and where the owners refuse to sell. If we are successful, NYC would buy the pub on our behalf at a price set by an independent valuer. Our latest plans for the refurbishment of the Henry Jenkins as a community-owned pub, bistro and coffee shop were set out at our annual general meeting in September. Committee members explained how the revival of the Jenks should benefit other local businesses as well as providing greater choice for villagers. The need for more facilities has been made more urgent by the village's continued expansion, with many more new houses being built or planned. A revived Henry Jenkins is part of wider plans supported by the parish council for regeneration and greater social inclusion in rural communities around Ripon.

Sawley Moor Lane Diary

It is nearly two months since the swallows were gathering on the electricity wires on the track before setting off south. We counted a wonderful host of over 120, many of which had been entertaining us for days with their spectacular and joyful flight.

A month later, on 20th October another joy was a pair of bats, bigger than pipistrelles, flying in between the trees at the top of Moor Lane reminding how mild it was still well into October. On Nov 4th a group of four brambling visited the bird table for the morning along with all our regulars.

After dispersing into the fields, the tree sparrows are increasing in number again and with the tits, dunnocks and robins, sometimes queue up in anticipation of their morning 8 o'clock bounty. We had a brief invasion of redwing and fieldfares making a smash and grab raid on the prolific hedgerow berries and every now and then flocks of starlings sweep past in groups of 50-100.

Among visitors to the bird table – it sits on an old coal bunker adjacent to the back hedge – is a brave and persistent vole and, sometimes a field mouse. If the blue tits could raise an indignant eyebrow they would! As the evenings draw in, gangs of jackdaw fly back to roost after a day over in Nidderdale, telling us firmly it is time to stop working outside, go in and have a cup of tea. They are often followed by the calls of not so secretive pheasants disturbing the peace and a scolding blackbird telling them to be quiet.
