Dear All,

This year Valentine's Day, the 14th February, is also Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent. So Christians lucky enough to be in a happy couple can choose between whether to hunt for a cheap way to celebrate their relationship with a romantic meal, or to go for the even cheaper option of spending the day in prayer and fasting. A rare instance, perhaps, of Christian faith offering some material advantage.

Yet the *spiritual* advantages to be gained from disciplined prayer and reflection throughout Lent, are many. As ever, there will be more than one Lent group or other activity offered to Christians and seekers after faith in the Fountains Benefice this year, and I would urge you to look through The Fountain to find what options are available.

However, here I'm going to suggest 'just one thing', (as Michael Mosley would say), a discipline which I'm intending to try for myself.

I like to have my life well-planned and under control. As part of this, a little bit of caring for other people is all very well, but it's less fun when somebody else's *unexpected* needs or concerns suddenly crash into my well-ordered life, and I have to change all my arrangements in order to lend a hand. But other people's illnesses, accidents, crises, and other needs of various kinds rarely happen according to plan, and rather than being irritated by the disruption they bring, this Lent I'm going to try harder to see such things as instances of 'disruptive grace' blessed opportunities to accept that God has no interest in my tightly-controlled little timetable of events, but requires me to respond in an attitude of loving acceptance to whatever unexpected challenges I may face in this coming year and in the years to come.

It's been a real encouragement to see more people at recent gatherings and we would love others to commit to this important time. See you there! (Please note that, due to the Lent Groups, we will not meet in March but will resume in April.)

Lent

The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on 14th February, and we will be sharing Holy Communion together (for all our benefice) at St James, Grewelthorpe at 7.30 pm. There will be an opportunity, for those who wish, to have our foreheads marked with a cross of ashes: a traditional sign of taking seriously the need for repentance for our sins, which led Jesus to the cross.

Lent Course

Our Lent course this year will focus on the idea of pilgrimage.

Confirmation

Confirmation can be a very important time in our Christian lives and church experience. It's a time when we declare our commitment to God and, if we were baptised as children, make for ourselves the promises which were made for us then.

We are hoping to have a Confirmation service in the summer of 2024, and anyone from any of our villages who thinks they may be interested in taking this important step should contact Ian (01765 650369, ian.kitchen@leeds.anglican.org) to have an initial chat about what is involved and to find out about preparation sessions. No one is committed to anything by this. Adults and young people are all welcome: the latter should be no younger than the top year of primary school. There is absolutely *no* upper age limit!





Sawley Moor Lane Diary

I have found a good source for coconut feeders and this particular blend is well liked by all our garden birds. The numbers are holding up well lots of blue tits, tree sparrows and all the other usual suspects including a wonderful mistle thrush which came and stayed so close to the window!

The most rewarding visitors are small flocks of long tailed tits which give the coconut

a star like appearance when they all have their heads in and tails out. This is a group of about a dozen birds and they arrive at frequent intervals through out the day before disappearing into the hedgerows again. They were birds much loved by John Clare and referred to in "Emmonsails Heath in Winter" calling them by their local Northamptonshire picture perfect name –

" And coy bumbarrels twenty in a drove Flit down the hedgerows in the frozen plain And hang on little twigs and start again."

The recent drier and less windy spell has brought about regular sightings of the barn owls as they magically fly over the fields searching for their tea. Maybe they found our vole as we haven't seen it since Christmas.

Walking up Moor Lane it is more noticeable to record what we haven't seen than sightings recorded. No sign of the deer, no geese in the fields, perhaps it is too early for flocks of lapwing – all is very quiet and still. Even the jackdaw seem reduced in numbers or taking a different track on their way to their evening roosts. Thank goodness for our garden birds!!
