Dear Friends,

I must have been about seven years old when my mother finally convinced me that Jesus, who was born on Christmas Day, did not die and rise again the following Easter. In part, it may have been down to my stubbornness, or perhaps, like many young children, I struggled to comprehend the concept of time, aside from getting up time, bedtime and the bits in between.



As humans, we relate to time on a linear basis, where the future moves into the present, which in turn slips into the past. For some of us, at least, the relentless march of time can feel overwhelming. From the moment of conception, we begin our passage through time, feeling its effects and being subject to its demands. We are temporal beings; our lives are determined by the framework of time and all its limitations.

But, through faith in God—omnipresent, timeless, and infinite—we glimpse an existence beyond time. A life eternal made known through Jesus, who, in obedience to His Father, took on the mantle of human temporal form, that we may believe in a life to come free from the constraints of time: where future, past, and present no longer bind us.

Over centuries, philosophers, theologians, and even some scientists have sought to explain timelessness and the nature of divine eternity: a state beyond the confines of time. Through His Son, Jesus Christ, God entered into time, not dependent on the days of the week or the synchronisation of clocks. All this deserves some serious reflection. However, for a seven-year-old lacking in theological or philosophical insight, the simple and uncomplicated love for Jesus seems to transcend time altogether.

<u>Lent</u>

Looking ahead to next month, the season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on 5th March, and we will be sharing Holy Communion together (for all our benefice) at St James, Grewelthorpe at 7.30 pm. There will be an opportunity, for those who wish, to have our foreheads marked with a cross of ashes: a traditional sign of taking seriously the need for repentance for our sins, which led Jesus to the cross.

Questions from Jesus: Together in Lent

Our Lent devotional series this year will focus on some of the questions which Jesus asked the people around him. We'll look at the Bible passages and also think about what our own answers to those questions may be. The purpose of the questions was to help people draw closer to Jesus and we hope this will be true for us as well.

We will run the sessions in two forms. On Saturday mornings, beginning on 8th March, Liz Jarvis has again kindly invited us to her home at Rose Farm, Low Grantley. These sessions will begin at 10.30 and last an hour or so.

We will also run the sessions online on Zoom on Wednesday evenings at 7.30, beginning on 12th March.

Electoral rolls - all change!

Any baptised person who lives in a parish or who attends a church regularly is entitled to be on the Electoral Roll for that church and to have a say in various aspects of church life. (This is completely different from the Register of Electors for local and national government elections, by the way.)

Every few years we have to scrap the existing Electoral Roll and compile a new one, and this is one of those years.

We'll be trying to get in touch with everyone who has been on the old rolls, but others who qualify are very welcome to join the new roll – there will be forms in the churches from the end of this month, together with more details and information on where to return the form to.

'Occasional Preachers' - training available

There are people in our congregations who are faithful Christians and have gifts from God which would make them helpful in occasionally delivering teaching in services but who are unable to commit at this stage to the responsibilities of becoming Licensed Lay Ministers (the role which Liz and Adrian fulfil). The Diocese provides training which would help these gifts to be developed and used, to a maximum of four times in a year. The training commitment is to eight evenings and one Saturday.

Preaching is an influential part of the Church's ministry and a privilege not to be taken lightly, so anyone undertaking the training needs consent from the Rector and the PCC. If you think this may be a suitable step for you to take, please contact lan in the first instance, to talk it through.

'Parish Share' - our churches' contributions to the diocese

The fact that local churches are asked to pay substantial sums to the diocese each year is a sore point for some and a source of confusion for others. This money basically goes towards clergy salaries. There is a helpful explanation on the diocesan website, including information about how much money the diocese receives from parishes and how much it pays out. Do have a look on the leeds.anglican.org website: type 'parish share guide' into the search box, click on 'parish share explained', and then click on the link to 'Our 2025 Parish Share Guide' under the picture of Bishop Nick. It's worth a look (the guide, not the picture of Nick).



Sawley Moor Lane Diary January 14th

The shower will fall from the heavens, Stirred by the wind

Scur sceal of heafenum, Winde geblanden*

We have had an eventful time since I submitted the last entry back in November. Gradually the blackbirds, thrushes, redwing and fieldfares consumed all the bright red berries from the hedgerow that had seemed so abundant. We returned from our pre-Christmas family and friends tour to find that Storm Dara pushed over a beloved Osmanthus baring the way to the garage, then I discovered it had also toppled three eighty-foot trees, a Scots pine that narrowly missed the little green house and a Norway spruce and Lawson's cypress in the wood creating quite a bit of turmoil.

After a comforting and traditional Carols in the Hall on the Saturday before Christmas, we woke to find a sprinkling of snow and a furious combat between the barn owl and kestrel over a meal which by all rights should have been the barn owl's.

Then the sun shone. Then the wind blew, and blew, and grew stronger and at 5.30 down came our big silver fir, blocking Marsden Well Road, bringing down an electricity pole and the telephone line. Northern Power were FANTASTIC! They were on the scene by 6.30. We had a quiet candlelit evening and by 1.30 on Monday morning a passageway was cleared through the fallen trunk, a new pole was up and the power was back on!

This was followed by a truly mild gentle Christmas until – the snow! Two days heavy falls and a week of enchantment and entrapment. We had very cold nights and days during which peace broke out between the robins in the garden four sometimes six robins feeding together with no arguments until the thaw then they were chasing each other off in every direction.

The snow and wind brought down the oldest tree in the nature reserve at Picking Gill a lovely crab apple its trunk split open and exposed white and bare. Careful planting of replacement apple trees will be called for in the spring.
