Dear Friends,

By the time the next magazine comes out at the end of August I shall have been a Christian for 50 years and married for 40. In both those relationships I have received far more than I have given, and been grateful beyond words for the patience and unfailing love I have experienced. Realising how long I have known both God and my wife Helen has made me reflect on the nature of commitment.

We live at a time when commitment seems to be harder for people than it once was. Charities and community organisations struggle to get regular volunteers; statistics tell us that marriages and similar relationships seem to be abandoned more readily than used to be the case; tough circumstances are often seen as a reason to give up rather than to endure.

Commitment is essentially contagious. Often it is the example of others which spurs us on to keep trying to achieve what is good and to resist the urge to give up. Equally, if people grow up in a culture where everything is disposable and the only valuable thing is what gives us pleasure at a particular moment, they are unlikely to cultivate the virtue – and it is a virtue – of commitment.

It is therefore important to choose our role models wisely, and to encourage others to do so. My skin crawls when I read of 'Influencers' on social media who have hundreds of thousands of followers but whose values, tragically, are often (though not always) superficial and unhealthy.

After 50 years as a follower of Jesus, it ought to be a given where I look for my example, though I can also bring to mind many Christian friends who have shown me the true nature and worth of commitment. I have found these words from the Bible (among many others) to be gloriously true:

The Lord is good to those whose hope is in him, to the one who seeks him.

(Lamentations 3:25)

All that the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never drive away.

(Jesus' words in John 6:37)

God is our strength and refuge, an ever-present help in trouble. (Psalm 46:1)

With such an example of loving commitment, so unbreakable that it led Jesus to the cross to die for lost humans, how can I do anything but rejoice and try as much as I can to mirror that commitment in my own life. I'm not great at it but God's commitment also means that he gives his Holy Spirit to change me from within and help me do a little more, bit by bit.

It will be for the good of ourselves, our families, our villages, our country and our world if we can maintain commitment to all that is good and helpful. Let us encourage each other and those around us to

be faithful and trustworthy in building up what is right, and in showing love as God has loved us.

May God direct your hearts into God's love and Christ's perseverance. (Paul's prayer in 2 Thessalonians 3:5)

#### The Benefice Book Club

This month we read "I Will Always Write Back" by Caitlin Alifirenka and Martin Ganda, which was an unusual choice for us in two respects. It is not a novel, but an exchange of real letters between a teenage girl in America and a boy in Zimbabwe. The correspondence began as a result of a pen-pal scheme arranged between two schools and the book traces the development of their unlikely friendship.

The second way in which "I Will Always Write Back" is unusual is that we were in complete agreement in our enjoyment of it. We learned a great deal about two social situations very different from our own. The contrast between the poverty of Zimbabwe and the affluence of the U.S.A. was both striking and moving. We looked at our own lives in the developed world and realised how much we expect and how much we take for granted. The style is unremarkable, as one would expect from the writing of two teenagers, but it is vivid and lively and we quickly came to recognise and sympathise with these two young people. An enjoyable and thought-provoking book.

We are now reading "Carrying Albert Home " in preparation for our next meeting. So far as I have read, I would describe it as a very different kettle of fish.



#### **Nature Notes**

#### Nature's Bounty indeed!

This spring's weather is certainly a challenge. No rain in February then a deluge in March then dribs and drabs until mid -May, and none since then, but heat / cold and winds. We were away for 2 weeks at the end of April, returning to find an explosion in the garden and the fields around us.

Meanwhile the birds have just got on with producing the next generations. Blackbirds a' plenty, song thrushes x 4 singing nearby in early morning and at least 2 from 3 to 10pm in our garden trees (surely their throats must get sore!!!!). Black caps, willow warblers, yellow hammers, tree sparrows, gold finches, chaffinches and of course all the tits whizzing around catching insects, the blue tits seem to specialise in cleaning out insect 'bits' from our gutters and their supports. The offspring are looking for parent beaks and food.

Up the hill the barn owl stalks the grasslands most evenings, the

ducks had a go at nesting at the big pond but gave up, the hares are nibbling at some of our young trees and visit the pond often, but were forgiven when I spotted a leveret in the fields. Lapwings have produced 2 bundles of fluff down by the river and the oystercatchers are thinking about it.

BUT only 3 swifts have been spotted once and the odd swallow, despite swift boxes at either end of the village. So glad Masham church has lots of swift boxes which appear to be occupied.
