Dear Friends,

A recent report by the British Medical Association set out to explain how algorithms are being deployed to detect which group of people are vulnerable to heart disease. This technology is also capable of gathering and collating weather data which will allow scientists to predict the level of future global warming, leading to a better understanding of how we may manage climate change.

These are just two examples of how Artificial Intelligence, known as AI, is being used to benefit society and the world. We also engage with AI in our daily lives, through smart watches, iPhones, and Alexa, to name just a few. Our relationship with technology is changing rapidly, and as AI displays an increasing ability to ape human behaviour, there is a real concern that the shift in power balance will make us increasingly dependent on that relationship. A dependence which can easily be seen to outweigh all other relationships, and has the potential to bind

us in servitude to the very object that we produced.  
Perhaps now is the time to carefully consider what this connection with AI represents, especially when we contrast it to our relationship with God, and with each other. In God, we have the freedom to know that through loving Him, we will experience His love in return. It is a mutual loving relationship. Our template for that relationship comes from Jesus Christ. His vulnerability as God's Son made flesh, His taking on human form, His giving of Himself: all this touches and embraces humanity in a way that can never be replicated.

It is this unique and particular existence of Jesus that draws us into an unequalled and unparalleled loving association with God, which in turn allows us to form loving relationships with each other. By continually turning to His love, by continually acknowledging our union with Him, we will have the strength and courage to embrace technology in the sure knowledge that the one true and absolute relationship rests with God.

### **The Benefice Book Club**

We have been reading "Year of Wonders" by Geraldine Brooks and while not a novel which could be enjoyed in the conventional sense, we all agreed that it is well worth reading. It is a fictionalised account of the events which took place in the village of Eyam in 1665. An itinerant tailor brought the plague to Eyam in a parcel of fabric patterns and the village made the sacrificial decision to isolate itself so that the plague should spread no further.

There is no need to emphasise the parallel with our own times and it gave us much to talk about. We felt, in the first place, that " it puts flesh on the bare bones of history " as one of our members said and the writing is graphic and atmospheric, if a little blood thirsty for some of us. It was impossible not to feel deeply for these people, especially in view of our own recent experience. No-one was made a scapegoat in contrast with our own times when we seem to need someone to blame. A thought-provoking novel and well worth reading.

In preparation for our next meeting we are currently reading " I Will always Write Back" by Caitlin Aliferene & Martin Ganda with Liz Welch.

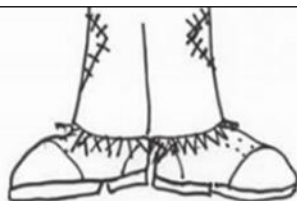

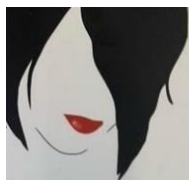
