#### From here to Eternity...

One of the joys for me of this current term has been the privilege of meeting on a weekly basis



with two small groups. On Mondays, several of us have been gathering to watch a short video helping us to get an overview of the Bible, and to discuss its content. The discussions have been lively and wide-ranging, and, whilst we're only ¾ of the way through the 8-week 'Bible Course' – as it's called – it has been encouraging to see folk growing in their confidence about voicing opinions. On Tuesdays, a number of us who completed The Bible Course last term have now turned our attention to the subject of Prayer – our conversations with God. Again, imaginatively titled, 'The Prayer Course', this 8-week series, presented as a conversation around the words of the Lord's Prayer, comes from the 24/7 PRAYER movement, and is supported by a book, 'Why Pray?', written by Pete Greig, the movement's founder. Those who have bought the book and been reading along have found it remarkably readable.

Prayer is one of those things which, surveys show, almost everyone does at particular moments of their lives — whether they would describe themselves as people of faith or not. These may include the 'highs' of welcoming a new baby into the world or when awestruck by a beautiful sunset, or the 'lows' of job- or relationship crises, or the death of a loved one. So, if we're moved to pray at those moments — and many would attest to having found comfort and hope in those

moments – why don't we, Pete Greig would ask, allow that to become a more regular part of our lives? Dr Andrew Ollerton, the main presenter of the Bible Society's 'Bible Course, would challenge us *all*, at some point in our lives, to spend some time finding out more about Jesus, and to discover the truth of his promise of 'life in all its fulness', offered freely to those who throw their lot in with him. It would be fair to say that getting hold of a copy of the New Testament in a contemporary language translation and reading Mark's Gospel (or maybe Luke's account), recording Jesus' life, death and resurrection, isn't a bad place to start! Then seeking out others who are interested in doing the same, and having a chat about what you've discovered, is a really good second step! It's amazing how people's lives are often changed – sometimes quite dramatically – when they start to encounter Jesus for themselves. If you're interested in doing that, why not get in touch?

This morning I opened the Bible App on my phone, to find a 3-minute talk given by guest presenter, Pete Greig (mentioned above). He was speaking about the impact of an encounter with Jesus on the life of an Australian from Sydney, a man who became a legend in his own lifetime. Arthur Stace had had a troubled early adult life, struggling from the effects of longstanding alcoholism. However, he experienced a dramatic turn-about following his conversion to faith in Jesus Christ at the age of 40. From then on, until his death, 36 years later, he chose to go out at night with yellow chalk and to write graffiti on municipal buildings and other public structures throughout the city. He wrote calligraphically, in beautiful 'copper plate', and limited his graffiti to a single word: 'Eternity'. It was estimated that during those 36 years, he wrote that word publicly over half a million times. So what was all that about?

From the ancient Jewish Wisdom tradition, we read in the book of Ecclesiastes that God 'has put eternity' into our hearts (Ch 3 v11 CEV). When confronted by a vocal religious group, angry at Jesus for challenging their religious rules, Jesus replied, 'Very truly I tell you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life and will not be judged, but has crossed over from death to life' (John's gospel Ch 5 v 24 NIV). Elsewhere, Jesus explained that he had come to offer us 'a rich and satisfying life' (John Ch 10 v10 NLT). In this encounter with Jesus, Arthur Stace discovered that Jesus' promise of forgiveness – offered from the Cross – was genuine and proved true. He experienced a new relationship with God as a result, and discovered that he had been given that 'rich and satisfying life', which is

genuinely a foretaste of heaven, the promised life of eternity. Maybe he was inviting his fellow Australians to reflect on their lives, and on what they anticipated would happen to them when they died? I don't actually know. However, what I understand is that his quiet witness had a profound effect on that city, and spoke a word of hope into many people's lives.

If we were given the gift of yellow chalk, and invited us to write a message of hope to our contemporaries, particularly during this time of political and environmental turmoil, I wonder what you, or I, might write? Maybe we'd discover the courage to write something equally enigmatic, yet, at the same time, uplifting - something truly hope-filled? I hope so!

#### **Praying for our benefice**

Prayer is crucial for everything we do; so we meet to pray for the life of our villages and our churches on the first Saturday of most months. Everyone is welcome to come and share this time – it doesn't matter if you've not prayed with others before, and if you're not confident in praying aloud no one is going to make you do so! God hears silent prayers as well as those that are spoken out loud.

We will meet for prayer again at **9.30 am** on **Saturday 1st March**, at **The Rectory** in Kirkby Malzeard. Light breakfast is available. We would love others to commit to this important time. See you there!

After this, there will be **no meeting in April** because of the Lent series (see below). In May we will meet on the **second Saturday**, **10th May**.

#### Lent

The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on 5th March, and we will be sharing Holy Communion together (for all our benefice) at St James, Grewelthorpe at 7.30 pm. There will be an opportunity, for those who wish, to have our foreheads marked with a cross of ashes: a traditional sign of taking seriously the need for repentance for our sins, which led Jesus to the cross.

#### **Questions from Jesus: Together in Lent**

Our Lent devotional series this year will focus on some of the questions which Jesus asked the people around him. We'll look at the Bible passages and also think about what our own answers to those questions may be. The purpose of the questions was to help people draw closer to Jesus and we hope this will be true for us as well.

We will run the sessions in two forms. On Saturday mornings, beginning on 8th March, Liz Jarvis has again kindly invited us to her home at Rose Farm, Low Grantley. These sessions will begin at 10.30 and last an hour or so. There will be further sessions on 15th and 29th March, and 5th and 12th April (nb not on 22nd March).

We will also run the sessions online on Zoom on Wednesday evenings at 7.30, beginning on 12th March for 5 weeks ending with 9th April. For Zoom links, contact ian.kitchen@leeds.anglican.org

#### Electoral rolls - all change!

Any baptised person who lives in a parish or who attends a church regularly is entitled to be on the Electoral Roll for that church and to have a say in various aspects of church life. (This is completely different from the Register of Electors for local and national government elections, by the way.)

Every few years we have to scrap the existing Electoral Roll and compile a new one, and this is one of those years.

We'll be trying to get in touch with everyone who has been on the old rolls, but others who qualify are very welcome to join the new roll – there are forms in the churches together with more details and information on where to return the form to.

#### 'Occasional Preachers' - training available

There are people in our congregations who are faithful Christians and have gifts from God which would make them helpful in occasionally delivering teaching in services but who are unable to commit at this stage to the responsibilities of becoming Licensed Lay Ministers (the role which Liz and Adrian fulfil). The Diocese provides training which would help these gifts to be developed and used, to a maximum of four times in a year. The training commitment is to eight evenings and one Saturday.

Preaching is an influential part of the Church's ministry and a privilege not to be taken lightly, so anyone undertaking the training needs consent from the Rector and the PCC. If you think this may be a suitable step for you to take, please contact Ian in the first instance, to talk it through.

#### **Keyboard skills**

We're not thinking about computers but pianos and organs. Do you play? Might you be willing to join the list of those who play our hymns on a Sunday, at any of the churches? You don't need to be a professional, and pianists can make a perfectly good sound on the organ even if the pedals are a complete mystery (just ignore them!). We do need more people to come and join in this important role, so please get in touch with Ian or Andrew if you are at all interested — help and guidance from our existing players will be arranged.

#### **Looking ahead**

We will be having a Day of Prayer on Tuesday 13th May, to give thanks and to look ahead with a particular view to what happens during the vacancy once Ian retires. The day (venue to be announced) will be designed so that anyone can drop in at any stage and stay for as much or as little as desired. More details will follow nearer the time but please note it in your diary now.

some leafleting around the local villages in the next few weeks. Below are details of two of their services which may be of interest to readers.


#### Here to HELP
