The Turning of the Season...

Dear Friends.

One of the joys of living in Grewelthorpe is having the wonderful Himalayan Garden and Sculpture Park just up the hill! Before moving

here, I was given annual membership as a farewell gift by the staff and governors of the church primary school in my last parish, after being a Foundation Governor for nine years.

It was a beautiful gift, and I must have used it nearly two dozen times in 2024, enjoying the early delight of azaleas and rhododendrons in full bloom to the end-of-season glory of the handsome maples. Jo and I visited on numerous occasions, regularly inviting family, friends and colleagues along – not to mention the dogs. It was a great place for a refreshing walk, a quiet chat and a tasty lunch; so much so that we re-joined this year – and did it all over again!

So, it was a lovely surprise to be invited to organise and lead a Quiet Day there for the Leeds Diocesan Spirituality Team in June. Thankfully, the weather was marvellous, the gardens – though a little past their late-Spring best – were still lovely, and the helpful staff made the two dozen of us attending very welcome. The feedback was warm and positive, so we plan a repeat in 2026.

During my recent walks there – largely with colleagues and those seeking a

quiet place to walk and talk – it has been very clear that summer is over and autumn upon us. Mercifully, the leaves, though beautiful in their golds and crimsons, have been clinging on, despite the storms of recent days. Perhaps as a result, I've recently found myself reflecting on Autumn, and how its 'closure' impacts our hearts and lives.

Suzannah Lipscomb, a professor emerita of Roehampton University, wrote recently in the Church Times of her struggles to let go of the warmth of summer: The sight of unpicked blackberries withering on the branch, and green acorns turning brown on the paths, is a piquant symbol of the end of summer. ... The swallows will disappear. Autumn will come, and, with it, another beauty arrives: morning mists, low sun, the changing colours of the leaves. Perhaps beauty is partly melancholic; perhaps the very loveliness of anything earthly rests on the fact that it does not last.

How easy it is to cling to the present – especially those things or moments which, though often imperfect, are at least familiar – in our nervousness about the future, simply because we don't know what it will bring. One thing that Nature teaches us about life is that change is normal, and has to be expected.

Without change, and learning to adapt to change, organisms die. As Robert Frost's poem puts it, "Nothing Gold Can Stay". What Nature at large can show us – and not just delicate, colourful butterflies emerging from their tough, drab chrysalises – is that whilst we may not relish change, or understand exactly how it will affect us, we can be reassured that if we actually submit to the process, we usually emerge at the other end better suited to what life then demands of us. Nature reminds us that spring's warmth follows autumn and winter's cold, just as day follows night.

A few niggles recently have caused me to reflect on my own mortality. Even in my early sixties, I'm painfully aware that I'm not as fit as I used to be, and my memory is not quite as good as it was! The media and social media influencers would suggest that my best years are way behind me. Yet I've been reminded recently of a lovely verse from the Old Testament (Isaiah Ch 46 verse 4, NLT), in which God reassures us that He doesn't abandon us in old age, but continues to value us, care for us, and provide for us right to the end of our lives:

"I will be your God throughout your lifetime — until your hair is white with age. I made you, and I will care for you. I will carry you along and save you."

For those of us who have allowed Jesus' promise of forgiveness, and his offer of a share in the life of eternity, to become the central truths of our lives, there is this beautiful reality – that our autumn years can be even more fruitful than those of our mid- life; and that the grim inevitability of Death is followed and gloriously surpassed by the Resurrection that He promises us; just as the bleak and killing cold of winter naturally gives way to the beauty and life-giving warmth of spring. And this gift of Life, 'life in all its fullness', as Jesus used to call it, is offered freely to us all!

Mary's meals (marysmeals.org.uk) have approached us, asking if we would be willing to hold a collection in our churches, on their behalf, of unused or returned overseas currency and out-of-date British currency. They sell these at a good rate to raise funds for their charity. They are an increasingly well-known international Scottish-based children's charity (reg no. SCO45223) who are now serving over 3 million free school meals every school day to children in some of the poorest countries in the world. On their website (see link above) they explain:

A nutritious daily meal served at school not only satisfies a child's immediate hunger, but it encourages children to attend consistently, improves their ability to learn and gives them better opportunities through education.

Over the years we have witnessed our volunteer-led school feeding programme act as a catalyst for generational change, empowering families and communities to work together in the fight against hunger and poverty.

The churchwardens have agreed to us holding this collection in all of our churches. There will be collecting jars in each church from the 9th to the 23rd November. Let's look out our foreign coinage/notes and out-of-date British money and give to this worthwhile cause!

Fountains Book Club - "The Light Between Oceans" by M.L. Stedman
A lighthouse keeper suffering PTSD after WW1, a very remote lighthouse with deliveries once a season and trips home every 2 years, a young wife who suffers miscarriages and a still birth, a baby washed up in a boat on their island shore and a dead body. If you are intrigued as to how all these things link together then read 'The Light Between Oceans' by ML Stedman.

All of the group enjoyed the book even though it was constantly challenging throughout with so many moral dilemmas. The book is beautifully written with vivid descriptions of both the Australian scenery and the characters. It is because the characters become so 'real' that the book creates such personally challenging questions- the reader can see issues from everyone's perspective and empathy, sympathy and anger keep shifting. Somehow the book manages to be both depressing and yet lined with hope. The only negative was the ending which left some feeling it was too neat whereas others felt it was just right and offered hope after all the trauma.

In summary the book is about what happens when a good, faithful man makes a bad decision and the fallout thereafter. Wholly recommended. Next month we are reading 'You are Here' by David Nicholls.





Wild Michaelmas Daisies

There is now a 22yd length of wild white Michaelmas Daisies growing joyfully along Marsden Well Road, often alive with the contented murmuring of bees and bright flashes of Red Admiral butterflies. This splendid year they were in full bloom before Michaelmas Day 29th September and adorned the church porch ready for what was once a highlight of the country year. I do hope St Michael was pleased.

How hill sunrises

One of the joys of walking down Moor Lane is the fine view of How Hill and the Tower built by the Aislabies out of the remains of St Michael's Chapel for a view point from the Studley Estate, a viewing point over the old deer park and a place for entertaining. It is capped by a wonderful Vanbrough designed roof.

But for me the most important thing is that two times a year, once after the autumn equinox and once before the spring equinox I can observe and track the movement of the sunrise and sometimes, if I'm very lucky, capture the moment when the sun rises exactly behind the tower. This happened this year!!

We have had an extraordinary run of sunrises for a week, at a most convenient time between 7.13 and 7.31am and for seven days in a row the uneven cloud cover and clear skies have given the best start and promise to the day to come. On Tuesday 7th October at 7.21am the sun rose behind the tower and like Winksley Church it seemed like a finger pointing to God (thanks Rev J.E. Torbett) with two red glowing headlights either side. Wonderful. One day the overhead clouds were lit red and purple for a long time, but on the 5th October there was a gentle morning sunrise just to

the north of the tower and its friendly trees.

And, thinly veiled, the reluctant sun Rose pale, almost to whisper A new morning, Another day won.

No boasting dish of deepest red No flares streaking across the skies No fanfares. But instead, a quiet morning. Oh, how I yearn for such another sunrise.


