Dear friends,

Have you noticed how brands and activists have started to rename months to support their causes? First we had Veganuary wished upon us, then farmers responded with Februdairy, and so on. I'll come back to that in a minute.

I was reminded recently how much of a sense of awe there is when Moses meets with God in the incident of the burning bush. (You can find it in Exodus chapter 3 if you need to refresh your memory.) That phenomenon of God showing himself in nature fills Moses with wonder and leads him to humility and obedience.

We sometimes feel such a sense of awe, and it's worth treasuring. Recently I saw the most beautiful display of stars and planets in the night sky – normally I'd resent my dog dragging me outside at 3 o'clock in the morning, but I forgave him because of the sense of wonder which filled me.

God can grab our attention in this way through all sorts of things:

landscapes (especially around here), newborn creatures, the sky, great music, an unexpectedly beautiful sound... There is no limit to the kinds of thing which can fill us with awe. It's true, as well, for the inspiring words we find in the Bible and the way our hearts can be lifted up in times of worship. The key thing when it happens is to recognise where it comes from, and to give thanks. It's too easy to take for granted things which we should use to direct our thoughts and hearts towards God.

In this month when autumn colours are appearing, and the weather can be truly awe-inspiring, I'd urge us all to keep alert for the things God may be using to help us recognise his voice calling to us, and to make sure that we respond.

So, forgetting Veganuary and Februdairy, I invite you this month to celebrate Awe-ctober. And may God lift up all our hearts to him.

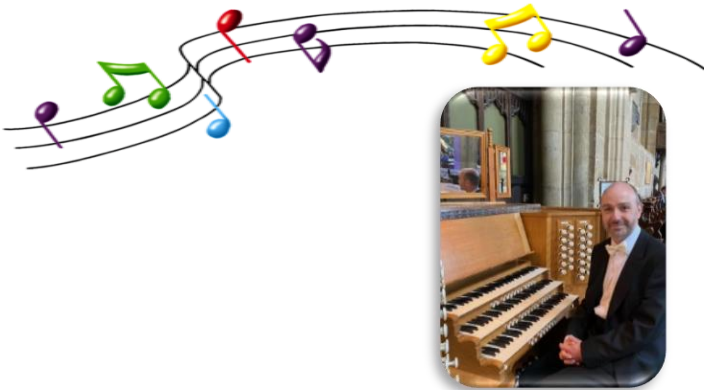

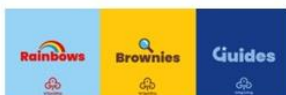

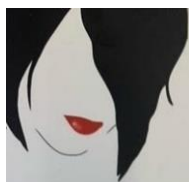
