Caring for this Beautiful World...

As I write this article, my wife Jo and I are not long back from 'Greenbelt', the long-established Christian festival, which takes place annually just outside Kettering.

10,000+ folk brave the huge site (mostly camping), with its wide mix of venues, multiple food outlets, composting loos and even less desirable toilets, and the famous 'Tiny Tea Tent' — a long-time favourite bohemian café serving gloriously exotic teas, brewed with water from a huge wood-burning boiler! The whole festival is quite an experience — full of life and colour! The 72 hours of events, with literally hundreds of artists, bands, poets, plays, dance- and craft workshops, and international speakers on numerous subjects, literally fly by in a blur of activity, complete with latenight DJs and all-night cafes for the *owls*, and early-morning yoga sessions for the *larks*.

Greenbelt holds a special place in our hearts, since it was here that Jo and I first met – in a big marquee run by the international mission and development agency for which I was working at the time. It then became an annual fixture for many years, and a favoured holiday event for our children while they were growing up.

Faith, and politically oriented since its start half a century ago, the festival has become significantly more inclusive and eco-focused in recent years, with a strong emphasis on action to combat climate change. Christian Aid remains one of the principal sponsors of the festival, touting an army of volunteers urging us to write to our MPs about climate issues. The vast openair Holy Communion service on the Sunday morning included a powerful live link-up with a West Bank Palestinian family based just outside Bethlehem, whose family have worked the same farm since 1916, but who are now surrounded by illegal settlements. Their brave non-violent resistance, and courageous decision not to give in to hatred and bitterness, despite regular provocation, was truly inspiring. The simple, yet moving, liturgy included music from Jewish and Palestinian origins. The hundreds of loaves of bread for the Communion Service had been baked earlier that morning and donated by a local craft bakery. The method of delivery to the thousands of seated worshippers was novel, to say the least! They were simply hurled into the crowd and then passed around by hand, until each group of a dozen folk had their own. Mercifully, as the sun shone, folk musicians played, a dancer spun, words – spoken and sung – and prayers were shared audibly and movingly, despite the huge distance between us, and we sensed God's presence among us.

When this article goes to print, we will be well into the Harvest Festival period, when we give thanks for all of God's provision for us, as curated by the hands of those who grow, rear, or fish for our food. We will also be well into the Church's annual season of 'Creationtide', when we remember the beauty of God's world, as we have inherited it, and the importance of passing it on to our children and grandchildren in a state which is at least as

beautiful and fruitful as it was when it was entrusted to our care. With recent scientific reports pointing towards a current average temperature rise approaching 1.5°C, and the ensuing climatic chaos associated with such increases, the daily choices we make become ever more important. While we may frown on the more extreme acts of disruption enacted by certain climate action groups, surely it is vital for each of us to play our part in greening the world around us and in deliberately limiting our use of non-renewable resources?

I recently came across a relevant and beautiful prayer by Angela Ashwin; a spiritual writer and retreat leader, whose retreat ministry I have valued in the past. I will finish with this:

In a world whose web of life is intricate and beautiful, save us, Lord, from carelessness and blindness. In a world whose creatures are so varied and vulnerable, save us, Lord, from plundering and cruelty. In a world whose waters are fresh and whose oceans should cleanse, save us, Lord, from wanton polluting. In a world whose forests protect our air and wild-life, save us, Lord, from the systems that drive us to destroy them. In a world whose fruits are rich and plentiful, save us, Lord, from waste and greed. **Amen**.

A Service of Remembrance and Thanksgiving for those who have died Every 2-3 years we hold a special service in the benefice to remember those whom we have lost, and to offer friends and families a formal space to give thanks for their lives and also to grieve. This year it will take place on Sunday 3rd November, at 3pm, in St Andrew's, Kirkby Malzeard.

At this service we will be remembering all those who have died during the last three years or so, and especially those whose funerals have taken place in any of the churches of the Fountains Benefice, or who have lived in our villages. It will also offer us a chance to remember those known to us personally who have died in years gone by and whom we still love and miss. 

Grewelthorpe Churchyard

As summer is here, we would once again like to draw your attention to one or two points about the churchyard. Unlike urban cemeteries that are looked after by the Local Authority, the upkeep of churchyards, as with the other expenses of a church, falls to the members of the congregation. We do pay for the regular grass cutting but **WE** would like to say thank you to all in the community who give donations especially towards the upkeep. The churchyard is a special place of rest for loved ones of past generations, and we know that it is treated with respect and love.

There are however a number of regulations imposed on us about churchyards, so please consult with a member of the clergy or the churchwardens about introducing a new gravestone or any maintainance of existing ones. In particular we wish to draw your attention to the fact that gravestones can become unstable, even relatively new ones. So we ask that relatives who remain responsible for the gravestones keep an eye on this for safety reasons. Very sadly a child in the district was killed by a falling gravestone, so we would ask that parents see that children do not play or run around the area.

For health and safety reasons, if a stone is found to be dangerous, we have to respectfully lie it down and we ask you for your understanding. We will do everything possible to contact the family, and inform them of our actions. We would then work together to help and restore the grave to its original state as soon as possible.

Our recent inspection of the churchyard has shown that there are several stones that have been found to have become unsafe.

KMLD GREEN TEAM

"KMLD Green Team is a group of local people, engaging with the wider community, carrying out practical conservation work to improve wildlife, the landscape and the countryside in the parish of Kirkby Malzeard, Laverton & Dallowgill. All welcome".

Back in March 2024 at the "Green Day" & on the village Facebook Group I asked if there was enough interest to set-up a parish based "Conservation Volunteer" group – The answer was a firm YES, and we now have 48 people signed up to a "KMLD Green Team" group on FB. We're aware that not everyone uses social media, so anyone who prefers can email me at phil.lyth@farmingandwildlife.net and we'll keep you updated with the occasional email (by doing so you're confirming that you're happy for us to keep and use your email address solely for information relating the KMLD Green Team).

At the moment we have a small "committee" comprising Phil & Patrice Lyth from Dallowgill, and James & Su Wood from Laverton. If anyone else would like to be actively involved in organising within the group that would be great, please get in touch with me!

This summer James & I attended public rights of way training organised by Nidderdale National Landscape & have adopted and surveyed the Crackpots Mosaic Trail in the Parish. A small group of us also helped a local dairy farmer to search for curlew nests to protect them from damage when silage making.

In due course we aim to meet to carry out practical conservation work in the parish at least once per month. We are pursuing funding to pay for the £157 insurance before we can do this, but at the moment nothing is forthcoming.

We have recently signed up to be a member of NORTH YORKSHIRE COUNCIL PATH KEEPERS SCHEME. This means that we can survey and make improvements to public rights of way in the parish, and be covered by the schemes insurance; it will be a great way for us to start to get involved in practical work to improve our area. NYC will send us any issues to follow up, but we can also be proactive in identifying improvements ourselves and supporting landowners where necessary.

To discuss how this will work in the parish we're having an informal meeting in the coffee room at the Mechanics at 7PM ON MONDAY 30^{TH} SEPTEMBER. We also hope to have a "bug hotel" building event on Lamberts Quarry this autumn.

THE MICKLEY BOYS' CLUB

Members were slightly concerned at the last Fountain issue listing them as OLD Boys' while they all think they are filled with youthful vigour!

At a lunch in the Staveley Arms they thoroughly enjoyed new member Chris Tapster introducing himself and then Roger Chapman speaking about Colonel Blashford Snell's upcoming event at Holy Trinity, Ripon on 1st November.

As this issue goes to print they anticipate a talk on Peter Liddle's *Lifetime in History*, the formal opening and a Barbeque on October 6th of the new foot bridge over a stream near Mickley Mill, designed by Boys' Club member, Adrian Hill, and then a visit to Chris I'Anson's new animal foods factory, Thirsk Mill, on October 24th.

Where are all the butterflies? Nature notes from Mickley

Butterflies seem to be having a terrible year, the national Big Butterfly Count has a lot of zero records from contributors 15-minute recordings, (finishing on 4 August). Our own land has yielded the normal number of whites (much to the gardeners' disquiet!!) and 1 or 2 peacocks, red admirals, tortoiseshells, meadow browns and ringlets with a steady flow of brimstones. Buddleias are empty. A slight increase in butterflies did happen at the start of September. Is it the wet?

However, on a hot, humid still night in early August, Mickley hill was lit up with 5 moth traps. Next morning 177 species of moths were identified of nearly 1500 moths. Two were new to the area, leaving the County Recorder nearly speechless!

So clearly the moths are doing much better than the butterflies.....

In the skies up to 15 swifts were seen one evening in August as a group at the west end of the village, swallows everywhere, a young osprey calling to its parents for food. (Nosterfield had up to 4 ospreys visiting), a spotted flycatcher using our aerial as a perch and the sparrow hawk continues to test the garden bird's acrobatics at our feeders; wonderful. Sadly, the barn owls have vanished as have the kestrels. Hedgehogs are still meandering around the village as are the hares....wonderful! The star of our garden was a green woodpecker feeding its teenager with ants from our patio.....keep going woodie!

As we all know the wet spring and early summer has produced bumper growth in plants and trees, all are prolific with flowers, seeds and berries (setting at least 4 weeks early) and are good for overwintering birds including our Scandinavian feathered visitors. Gardens are bursting with flowers, road sides and some fields with ragwort (which has gone berserk) but a lot fewer insects than usual as well. And as for apples we are all desperate to know what to do with them all, windfalls everywhere!
