Dear All,

The Church of England is an odd institution. It is an official, national church, which has to keep its buildings up and running without any official, national support. It relies on voluntary contributions, and many of its buildings, including some in this area,



are of unique beauty and historical significance. It is also an institution in which there are many different opinions about beliefs, practices and styles of worship.

These different opinions sometimes cause very public disagreements and squabbles. I think this is actually a strength, for it shows that we can seek to live out our Gospel message of love towards each other even in the midst of differing views, without pretending there is an enforced uniformity (impossible among people free to speak their minds). And of course, in common with other Christian denominations, at the heart of this message lies the belief that God is fundamentally a God of love, who has acted decisively to conquer the power of wickedness, hatred, and death itself, through living, dying and rising again in a human life, the human life of Jesus.

Quite how this conquest works is a mystery, which can only be expressed in

varied and more or less effective metaphors, involving concepts such as redemption, ransom or sacrifice. But for me, one of the greatest strengths of the Church of England is that, far from being an inward-looking cult or sect, it regards itself through its ancient parish system as responsible for the care of all those living within a geographical area.

So, this means that whether or not you come to church (though I hope you will), whether or not you want to help keep our beautiful buildings standing (and that would be nice too), we as the active Anglican Christians in this place will continue to try to be here for you all in any way you may feel the need for our support. And at the very least, we will keep you all constantly in our prayers.

Launching the new 'Abbots' Way' Pilgrimage

- the first of our three 'Fountains Ways - Ancient Paths for Modern Pilgrims'

After months of planning, the 'soft launch' of the new 'Abbots' Way' will take place on Saturday 13th September, coinciding with the annual Yorkshire Churches Day. It is hoped that many folks from across North Yorkshire will join us for this special day!

Following a Lent study series on Pilgrimage and subsequent Pilgrimage from Winksley to Fountains Abbey, in 2024, 'Abbots' Way' aims to get people out walking in this glorious Nidderdale area, visiting four beautiful rural churches located in the Fountains Benefice - including William Burges' famous St Mary's, Studley Royal, by Fountains Abbey – and enjoying good local hospitality.

Recognising the growing interest in Pilgrimage nationally and internationally, the 'Fountains Ways' project group are working on a series of three interlocking Pilgrimages, of which this is the first. These will be formally launched, with the support of North Yorkshire County Council, particularly its NY Tourism team, by Easter 2026.

In addition to OS Map-bearing descriptive leaflets, church welcome boards will help the pilgrims both to view the buildings and engage with church community life. Church 'stamps' – like those used on the various *Caminos* – will, in time, be available to stamp pilgrim 'passports', and children's quizzes etc will offer young people a way of also participating. In time, and with NY Tourism support, the relevant information will be web-based, accessed via QR codes.

Tom Ramsden, Churchwarden of St John's Church, Mickley, Chair of YHCT, and coleader of the group, commented, 'This is a wonderful opportunity to enjoy the churches, the heritage and the landscape of beautiful Nidderdale'. So, on Saturday 13th September, YC Day, a group of us will meet at Sawley, nr Ripon, at 10.30am (parking on the village green), to start an accompanied walk, and taking packed lunches. The first stop will be just nearby, at St Michael and All Angels, Sawley. The second church stop is St Mary's, Studley Royal (open 11.30am-3.30pm). *En route*, we may wish to make use of the facilities or purchase refreshments from the Fountains Abbey Visitors' Centre.

From there, we'll head towards St Cuthbert and St Oswald, Winksley, a beautiful early 20th Century 'Arts and Crafts' building (open from 1pm onwards). Additional toilet facilities will be available nearby. The fourth church visit is to St Lawrence, Aldfield, a fine 18th Century building with box pews and triple-decker pulpit, largely untouched since its construction. The final leg of the Pilgrimage will take us back across the River Skell, and up to Sawley.

The whole route is about 9 miles which we estimate will take about 6 hours, including breaks, walking at a gentle pace. There may be an option of losing a section, for those seeking something slightly shorter. The going is moderate, and there are a number of stiles to cross. Stout footwear is recommended, and waterproofs, in case of rain. The 'draw' at the end is The Sawley Arms, a muchappreciated local pub, with a cosy interior and decent exterior seating.

In June we read 'Cold Comfort Farm' by Stella Gibbons. It was chosen because people had read it many years ago and enjoyed it but it is interesting how the passing of time affects how you respond to a book. On rereading several couldn't understand why they had liked it, those reading it

for the first time did not enjoy it and only a couple still liked it. It was felt to be very much a book of its time. It is a comic novel that parodies the romantic ideas of rural living and is about a spoiled rich girl who becomes an orphan, refuses to work and goes to live with her family at the Farm where she then meddles with all of their lives. There were too many characters with unusual names to remember and nobody warmed to the main character. Some people did feel an affinity with the Farm itself. It is viewed as 'one of the best comic novels of all time' but this was not agreed with by us. If, however, you want to find out what happened in the coal shed then read it.


What is the point of life? Why am I here? What is heaven? If you fancy contemplating these questions then read our July book 'Five People You Meet in Heaven' by Mitch Ablom. A complete contrast to our June read but enjoyed much more. A fairground worker dies while trying to save someone at work and as he enters heaven there are five people waiting for him, each of whom either he had an impact on or they on him. He has to come to terms with the ramifications of all their actions and it makes the reader question how their actions might have impacted on others (having several ex-teachers in the group this was a scary thought!!). This book is written in a deceptively simple way, tenderly raising lots of very deep and thought-provoking ideas and questions. It is worth a second read once you have assimilated everything that happens.

Sawley Moor Lane Diary for September

This has been a most splendid summer for butterflies and day time flying moths. They have been abundant and restricting lawn mowing has paid dividends this year. The honey scent of Buddleia has brought heaven sent Admirals, Tortoiseshells, Comma, Peacocks and many whites flocking to feed and we have had the widest variety of bees and flies for many years. My despair at the low numbers of insects from two years ago is drifting into the distance.

We hosted a small group of Nidderdale Birdwatchers to walk our patch and my diary entry follows. It was a lovely summer's evening.

Our patch walk - Monday 21st July, Sawley Moor Lane

We began the evening with a stroll around the Flexman's garden, discussing wildflowers and butterflies and the evening Plume Moths flying up from the long grasses in the wildflower patch. Rattle was still in flower but the orchids were mainly happily going to seed. A Monday evening in late July was never going to give a long bird list but the stroll up Moor Lane produced sightings of hares, rabbits, a kestrel across the field in the far hedgerow, a curlew, pheasant, swallows at the top of the lane and some finches which were definitely green or gold!! Very hard to decide as they were on telegraph wires silhouetted against a bright sky.

When we arrived at the Nature Reserve at Picking Gill we found a very appropriate toad near the ponds and a fine collection of insects on ragwort flowers. A quick demonstration of a top of the range smart phone produced wonderful close ups of soldier beetles and, by pressing the "what-in-the-world-is-this-creature?" button, an

identity to a green beetle with the grand name of Clostoratomus norwegicus. It was far prettier than its name.

Picking Gill is the site of a former stone quarry. At the lowest point is the Wine Wife Well – really a stone framed spring that never runs dry even in the severest drought, then a middle level by the road and a fine rise of land above. You can gaze up through the branches of the oaks from the bottom or across the canopy at the top. It is a site of great calm and very appropriately here you can find a memorial to the three men from the Sawley area who were killed in the First World War and whose names are remembered on an old stone gate post that probably came from the quarry. A stone gatepost that they all would have known because it came from Butcher's Field where animals were brought before being walked down to the village slaughter house.

The walk back down the Lane was easy and relaxed walking between drifts of both kinds of willow herb, knapweed and greater burnet saxifrage at its frothy best.

There were three more hares in the fields and then a real treat – two kestrels were calmly watching a new sown field from the advantage position of a huge ash tree, a close and clear view for the birdwatchers, unless the birds were marking off the humans on their lists.

The evening concluded with nibbles and a glass of wine outside on a lovely summer's evening.


